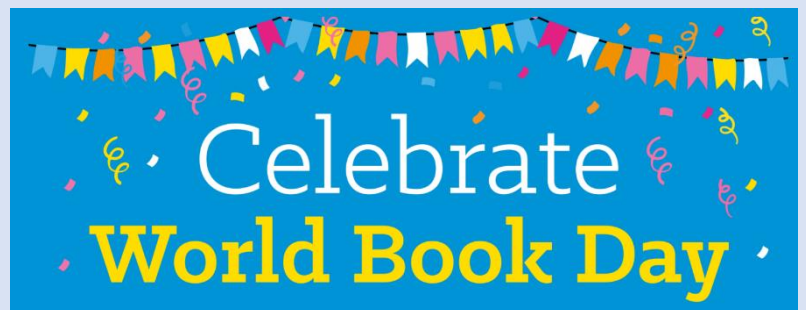

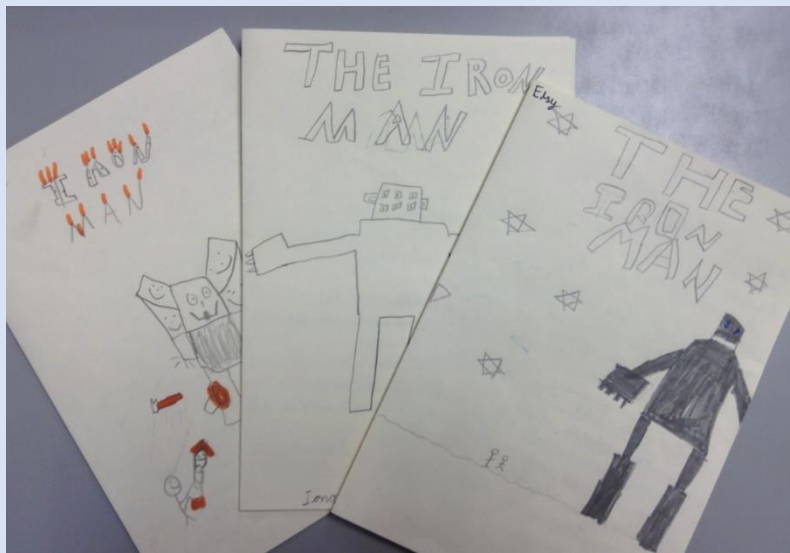


Annie by Olivia Walker

Year 3 created their own 'Iron Man' stories.

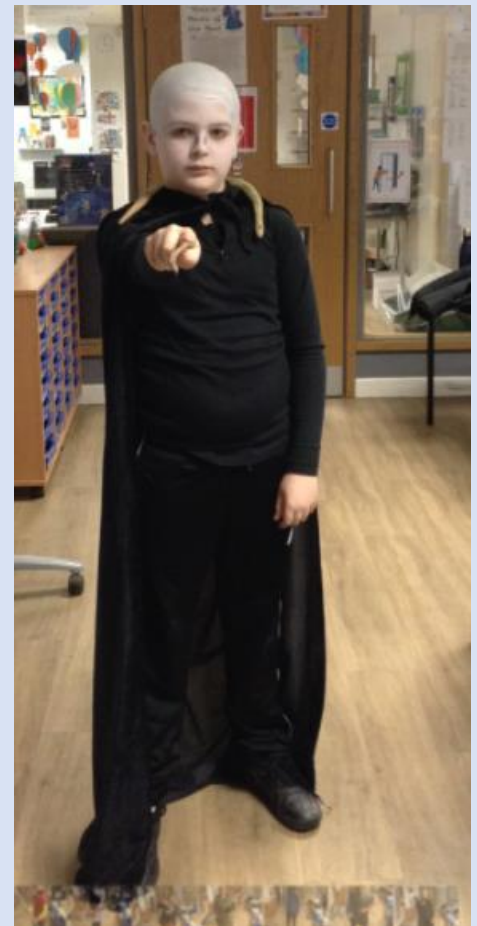
Suddenly the iron man started throwing all the play equipment everywhere! He hit buildings and houses, smashed cars and even ate some. Then the whole of the park was shut down.

There are 6 elements which support a child reading for pleasure:

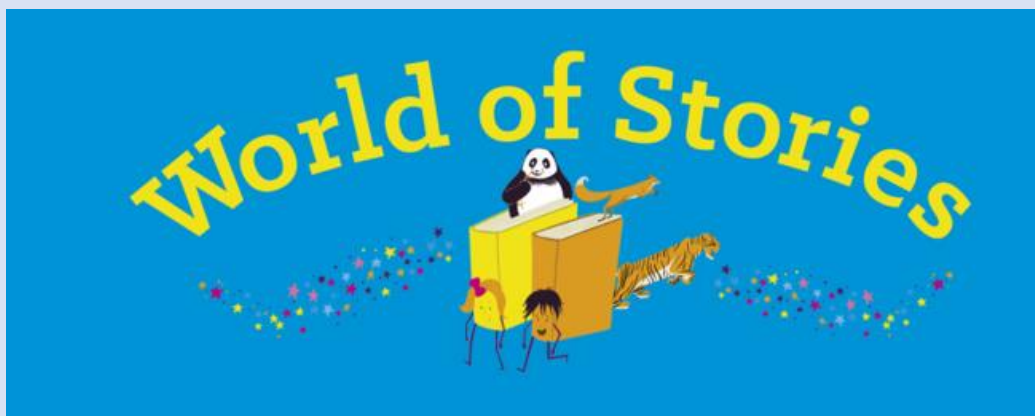
1. Being read to regularly
