Our PE curriculum aims to increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all pupils learning and staff teaching PE whilst providing a broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils. It also aims to increase participation in competitive sport both in trust-wide and authority-wide competitions.

In our continued work with SW Sports Coaching, we have the opportunity to use funds in a variety of ways to further improve and develop the teaching and learning across the academy. A key area of focus this year is for our new school teachers (ECTs and HLTAs) to build their expertise and confidence in teaching PE, by working with professionals in a range of targeted areas. We will begin to target specific children to engage in school sport, be it after-school clubs or school competitions. This year we will continue to work with SW Coaching who will lead sessions whilst offering development to teachers across the academy, through co-taught lessons, twilight training and competitions.

We will be delivering our new PE Curriculum and assessment model to ensure we have progression of skills across the school and so that we can track development across the year.

We participate in a large number of local and regional events and we are the Delta Trust Athletic Champions (2022). This provide a great sense of community pride, as well as providing opportunities for personal development and the nurturing of talent. We will continue to provide a vast range of opportunities for both competitive and non-competitive PE and Sporting activities.

The academy recognises the positive impact on the quality of the teaching of PE and the need to use our funding in 2022/2023 to promote a range of sporting activity and healthy lifestyles.
